

## Entry Criteria

### Bachelors


- Minimum 65%-90% in High school for universities
- Minimum 55%-60% in High school for colleges

### Masters

- Minimum 55%-75% in Graduation  
(Some Universities may need 4-year Bachelor's degree for Computer and Engineering )

### English Requirement

IELTS 6.5 with no band less than 6.0. IELTS 6 with no band less than 5.5 is also acceptable in some Universities and Colleges. (May vary by university and course)  
TOEFL, PTE, DET is also accepted for most of the Institutions

# Application Process Flowchart

- 1 Application Submission to University/colleges
- 2 Get Conditional/Unconditional Offer from University
- 3 If Conditional: Fulfill the same to get unconditional offer and pay deposit.  
If Unconditional: can pay the deposit directly.
- 4 Pay Tuition fees (as mentioned in Offer) & Proceed for VISA Filling

## Visa Process

**(Student can start VISA filling process 5 months prior intake start)**

### 1 Fill and submit Online AVATS Form

- The applicant must complete the online form on the official Irish Immigration website.
- It must be ensured that the ILEP number is mentioned, and all details match the passport and other supporting documents.

### 2 Book an Appointment and Pay VISA fees

- After submitting the AVATS form, the applicant should book an appointment at the nearest VFS Global Visa Application Centre.
- The visa fee is INR 18,608 (including check-and-verify and other service charges).

### 3 In-Person Visit to VFS Centre

- The applicant must attend the appointment on the scheduled date.
- All required original documents and photocopies must be carried for the appointment.

### 4 Wait for Decision

- Processing times vary, typically between 4-8 weeks.
- The applicant may receive communication requesting additional documents or an interview.
- Once approved, the visa will be stamped on the applicant's passport.

## Work Rights

- 20 hrs/week (part-time during academic session)
- 40 hrs/week (During holidays)
- Minimum wage: €13.10/hour
